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# GUIDE FOR AUTHORS

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## INTRODUCTION

The Revista Brasileira de Entomologia (RBE), edited on behalf of the Sociedade Brasileira de Entomologia (SBE), publishes original peer-reviewed papers in Entomology, focusing on systematics, diversity, and evolution of insects.

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To avoid unnecessary errors you are strongly advised to use the 'spell-check' and 'grammar-check' functions of your word processor.

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Manuscript length should not exceed 80 pages, including figures. In the case of longer manuscripts, authors should consult the Editorial Board previous to submission.

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State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results.

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#### *Results*

Results should be clear and concise.

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This should explore the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. A combined Results and Discussion section is often appropriate. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature.

#### *Conclusions*

The main conclusions of the study may be presented in a short Conclusions section, which may stand alone or form a subsection of a Discussion or Results and Discussion section.
