|               | the text does not include abstract, keywords, references, and figures.   |
|               | • Check that all references and figures are cited in <b>sequential</b> numerical order in the text;                            |
|               | • Authors' names and affiliations should not appear in the body of the text while the manuscript                               |
|               | is under peer review. This information should be replaced by XX. After the article has been approved, please include the data. |
|               | <ul> <li>Acknowledgments, if any, must appear at the end of the text and before the list of references.</li> </ul>             |

| FIGURES       | Each illustration may be composed of 2 images maximum.   |

| DOCUMENTATION | Three documents must be sent during the submission:  |
|               | a. Copyright Transfer Agreement Form   |
|               | b. Conflict of Interest Statement - authors must inform the types of conflicts when they exist.                                |
|               | c. Consent for Publication of Patient Images – only necessary if they portray the patient's face.                              |
|               | • Documents must be <b>signed by all Authors</b> in a single file or individually and sent when the manuscript                 |
|               | is submitted. Templates can be found <u>on the journal website</u> .   |

| REVISIONS     | Be conscious of the deadlines for submitting your revisions.   |
