# INSTRUCTIONS TO CONTRIBUTORS, Revista Española de Cardiología

Revista Española de Cardiología (Rev Esp Cardiol) is an international scientific journal dealing with cardiovascular medicine.

Rev Esp Cardiol, the official publication of the Spanish Society of Cardiology, publishes research articles related to cardiovascular diseases. Articles are published in Spanish for the paper edition and in both Spanish and English in the electronic edition, which is available on the Internet. Regular sections include original articles reporting clinical or basic research, scientific letters, review articles, editorials, and letters to the Editor.

The electronic edition of *Rev Esp Cardiol* contains the complete version of the journal in Spanish and English and can be found at the following address: www.revespcardiol.org.

All original manuscripts will be peer reviewed by specialists appointed by the editors. Submission of a manuscript to *Rev Esp Cardiol* implies that it is the author's original work, and that it has not been published or has not been sent for peer review elsewhere. Editorials and review articles are written for publication by invitation of the Editor.

Accepted papers become the property of the Spanish Society of Cardiology and permission must be granted if a published paper is to be reproduced partially or in full. The corresponding author must sign a letter transferring copyright once the paper has been accepted.

# ETHICAL GUIDELINES

Authors who submit a manuscript accept full responsibility for its content as defined by the International Committee of Editors of Medical Journals (see www.icmje.org and Rev Esp Cardiol. 2004;57:538-56).

The research reported in papers sent to *Rev Esp Cardiol* should be carried out in accordance with internationally accepted recommendations for clinical investigation (Declaration of Helsinki, in the recently revised version of the World Medical Association; see http://www.wma.net/en/30publications/10policies/b3/index.html), or recommendations for laboratory research involving animals published by the American Physiological Society. Randomized studies should follow the CONSORT guidelines.

## Authorship

Rev Esp Cardiol ascribes to the authorship criteria for scientific articles defined by the International Committee for Medical Journal Editors. Thus, authors must fulfil all the following criteria:

- Substantial contributions to the conception or design of the work or the acquisition, analysis, or interpretation of data for the work.
- Drafting the work or revising it critically for important intellectual content.
- Final approval of the version to be published.
- Agreement to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved.

### **Informed consent**

If patient information, photographs or data are reproduced, the patient should not be identifiable. In all cases, the authors must have obtained written informed consent from the patient (or parent, guardian, or next of kin where applicable) for publication at *Rev Esp Cardiol* and dissemination in print and electronic form. Also, the authors are responsible for obtaining the appropriate permission to reproduce in *Rev Esp Cardiol* any previously published material (text, tables, or images.) These permissions must be requested from both the author and the publisher of such material.

# **Data protection**

Unless otherwise stated, by submitting your article you expressly authorize that your name, surname, contact address, and email will be published in *Rev Esp Cardiol*, the annual summary published by SEC, and on the webpage (www.revespcardiol.org) in order to acknowledge authorship of the article and to assist readers in contacting you.

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

Only methods of studies that comply with the following will be considered for publication:

- A prospective randomized study design has been obtained.
- Consent of the institutional review board or local ethics committee has been obtained.
- Signed patient consent forms have been obtained.
- Funding for the study has been approved.
- The study has been registered with a clinical trial registry (e.g. www.clinicaltrials.gov)

All manuscripts must follow the style of *Rev Esp Cardiol*. It is understood that the corresponding author takes responsibility for following the guidelines and that the other authors are aware of them, have participated in preparing the manuscript and fully agree on its content.
