

INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

PUBLICATION RULES

The REVISTA DE PSIQUIATRÍA Y SALUD MENTAL (RPSM) is the official journal of the Spanish Society of Psychiatry (SEP) and the Spanish Society of Biological Psychiatry (SEPB), focusing on the study of mental disorders, their pathological processes and their psychosocial consequences, and aims to spread scientific advances in all fields related to mental health and illness. Unpublished articles will be published on psychiatry and mental health and based on their medical, social and behavioural impact; therefore, the Journal will accept for publication biological, clinical and psychosocial articles. The Journal conforms to the rules of the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (<http://www.icmje.org>), thus articles should be drafted according to its uniform requirements. In addition to being considered by the Editorial Board, all original articles will be externally and anonymously evaluated by peer-review before being accepted. Submitting an article to the REVISTA DE PSIQUIATRÍA Y SALUD MENTAL implies that it constitutes an original manuscript that has not been previously published or is being considered for publication in another journal. Previously published articles will not be accepted. Authors are responsible for obtaining the relevant authorisation to partially reproduce material (text, tables or figures).

Authorship. The list of authors should include only those persons who satisfy each of the following requirements:

1. Participation in the conception and design of the study that has resulted in the article in question.
2. Participation in the drafting of the text and its possible reviews.
3. Final approval of the version to be published.

Conflict of interest. Authors must disclose any personal or financial associations that could lead to a conflict of interest regarding the published article, even if they believe that there is no conflict of interest.

Ethical responsibilities. When reporting experiments on human subjects, authors should indicate whether the procedures followed were in accordance with the ethical standards of the responsible committee on human experimentation (institutional or regional) and with the World Medical Association's Declaration of Helsinki (<http://www.wma.net/s/ethicsunit/helsinki.htm>). No names, initials or hospital numbers should be used, especially in the figures. When reporting experiments on animals, authors should indicate whether the guidelines of an institution or other international research councils or a national act regulating the care and use of laboratory animals were followed.

Informed consent. Authors should mention in the "methods" section that the procedures used in patients and in the follow-ups have been carried out after obtaining the patient's informed consent. If photographs or patient data are used, the authors are responsible for obtaining written permission, authorising their publication, reproduction and dissemination on paper and on the Internet.

SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS

ARTICLE TYPES

Original Articles are research papers that contribute new results concerning the Journal's areas of interest. Manuscripts should be divided

into the following sections: Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion and References. The recommended length of the text is 3,000 to 3,500 words (excluding the abstract, tables, figures and references), equivalent to approximately 12 A4 pages, double spaced with Arial font size 12. The text should include a maximum of 6 tables and figures (charts, graphs or illustrations). Authors are also advised to limit the number of references, if possible, to a maximum of 40 references. Original articles must be accompanied by an abstract of maximum 250 words that includes the following sections: Introduction, Material and Methods, Results and Conclusions. For the publication of randomised controlled trials, authors are also advised to meet the CONSORT criteria, available at: <http://www.consort-state-ment.org>

Short Original Articles are research papers that because of their special features (articles with a small number of cases, descriptive epidemiological studies and papers with very specific objectives and results) can be published in abbreviated form. The text is limited to 1,500 words, a maximum of 2 figures and/or tables and up to 15 references, and should begin with a structured summary of no more than 250 words.

Reviews are updates of a problem relevant to biological, clinical or psychosocial topics, and provide the necessary literature for this purpose. While it is preferable that review articles are assessed by the Journal's editors, spontaneous contributions are welcome. The recommended length is the same as that for original articles. The unstructured abstract of the paper should be as brief as possible (about 150 words), but fluent in reading and conclusive of the issue in question. However, in order to avoid unnecessary deliberations, there should be an agreement in advance on the subject and length of the manuscript with the editors.

Letters constitute "Scientific Letters", which include new studies that can be demonstrated briefly, and "Letters to the Editor", where readers can express their conforming or non-conforming reasoned opinion on a recent publication and on an issue they consider extremely relevant. Letters are intended to encourage and foster dialogue and discussion among the Journal's professional readers. Contributions should be accurate and properly argued, preferably with a maximum of 10 references. The text should be limited to 750 words, and preference will be given to the most concise, brief and comprehensive letters. The Journal reserves the right to shorten the letter's text, whether for exceeding the established length or for repetitions affecting its fluent reading.

Editorials are usually commissioned. However, the editorial board may consider unsolicited editorials for publication and submission to the review process, for which prior agreement is advisable.

MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION

All manuscripts should comply with the publication policies. Manuscripts should be written in Spanish and/or English, and should be double-spaced, with margins of 2.5cm and numbered pages, in accordance with the following order:

Title page. The title page should contain the title, first name and one or both surnames of the authors, as well as their institutional affiliations and the institute's population. The first page should also include the contact information of the corresponding authors, including their full mailing address, telephone and fax numbers and e-mail address. This page should be attached separately from the rest of the article on the Web site (<http://ees.elsevier.com/rpsm>)

Abstract . The abstract should be drafted according to the type of article to which it belongs (see "Article Types"). A maximum of 5 keywords (using terms found on the Medical Subject Headings [MeSH] and on the Index Medicus) should be included at the end of the abstract. Authors should include the English version of the abstract, title and keywords. Because of its importance in achieving the widest possible dissemination of the publication, the English version of the abstract should be as comprehensive as possible. Authors are therefore advised to give the abstract for revision to a native English speaker, preferably a professional in the field reported on in the article.

Text. The structure and length of the text depend on the type of article to which it belongs. References should be numbered consecutively and in superscript in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text.

References. References should be numbered consecutively and in superscript in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text. References should be sent as standard text and not as footnotes. Authors should not include references that are difficult to access or verify, such as conference proceedings or personal communications. Authors are responsible for the accuracy and proper presentation of the references, which should follow the style recommended by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors for biomedical journals, available from: http://www.nlm.nih.gov/bsd/uniform_requirements.html

List all authors when there are six or fewer. If more than six, list the first six followed by "et al.":

Acknowledgements. Acknowledgements may be expressed to individuals or entities that helped in the completion of the study. In this case, according to the criteria of the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors, authors should mention individuals and the type of support provided, as well as the entities or institutions that financed the study or supplied materials. Concerning funded research projects, authors should only mention the registration code and the entity, institution or foundation that supports the project financially.

Tables. Tables should be listed with Arabic numerals in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text. Each table should be typed on a separate page at the end of the text. They should include a title in the heading, while the abbreviations used should be explained in alphabetical order in footnotes. The content should

be self-explanatory, and the data included should not be listed in the text or figures.

Figures (graphs, diagrams or illustrations). Photographic or microscopic images of poor quality with insufficient demonstrative value will not be accepted. Authors are advised to use JPG or TIFF format with a resolution not less than 300 dots per inch (dpi). The size should also be 9 × 12cm. No images presented in colour will be accepted. Figures should be numbered with Arabic numerals in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text. Figure captions should be included on a separate page at the end of the text, identified by Arabic numerals. Abbreviations used should be identified in alphabetical order. Photographs of people must be such that cannot reveal their identity or must be accompanied by the person's written permission to use the photograph.

EDITORIAL PROCESS

Receipt of manuscript will be immediately confirmed by the Journal. Following its assessment by the editors, the paper will be evaluated by independent experts. The final result will lead to either the acceptance of the manuscript, its return to make corrections for the preparation of the revised manuscript or the rejection of its publication in the Journal. Except for the first case, decisions will be communicated to the author with the relevant arguments. Prior to the publication of the article, the corresponding author (mentioned on the first page of the manuscript) will receive the final version. The author must respond within 48 hours, giving his/her approval for printing or mentioning any other corrections, if necessary. Corrections should be limited to printing errors, not additions or changes to the original.

The undersigned authors of the manuscript concerned, entitled "_____" and submitted for publication in the above mentioned journal, DECLARE that:

- It is an original work.
- It has not been previously published.
- It has not been submitted simultaneously to another journal.
- All the authors mentioned have contributed intellectually to its design.
- All the authors mentioned have read and approved the manuscript submitted.
- If published, all copyright shall be transferred to the editor, whose express permission is obligatory for material publication in the Journal.
- The editorial board does not necessarily agree with the authors' claims in the article.
